JÉRÔME BATOUT
BUSINESS LEADER AND INTELLECTUAL
FRENCH 2018 YOUNG LEADER

Jérôme Batout started his career as an M&A analyst at Credit Suisse. He worked as Project Administrator for Doctor Without Borders in the Afghan / Pakistani border areas. He then focused his career on media and communications in France and became Chief of Staff to Maurice Lévy (CEO Publicis Groupe) in 2011. He was appointed Special Adviser to Prime Minister of France Jean-Marc Ayrault in charge of Strategy, Media

and Communication in 2013. In 2016, Jerome was named Managing Director at Publicis Media France, one of the 4 business divisions of Publicis Groupe.

Since 2014, Jérôme Batout is an Editorial Advisor to French intellectual review Le Debat, published by Gallimard in Paris. Working alongside Pierre Nora and Marcel Gauchet, founders and editors, Jerome Batout is part of the editing process and regularly contributes to this landmark publication in the French intellectual landscape.

Jerome is a graduate from the London School of Economics and Sciences Po Paris, and holds a PhD in Philosophy and Social Sciences from the École des Hautes Études en Sciences Sociales (EHESS). His doctoral thesis focused on the modern understanding of value in economics and philosophy. He was a lecturer in finance at the London School of Economics from 2003 and 2009, and seconded to the Chulalongkorn University (Bangkok) and to Beida (Peking University).



RANIA BELKAHIA
PRESIDENT AND CO-FOUNDER, AFRIMARKET
FRENCH 2019 YOUNG LEADER

Leaving Casablanca at the age of 17 to pursue her graduate studies, Rania Belkahia, a graduate of Télécom ParisTech and HEC Paris, co-founded Afrimarket in 2013. To date, she has raised 20 million euros from Orange, Xavier Niel and Proparco (among others) to develop her business. Afrimarket is now one of the African leaders in e-commerce, operating in difficult markets such as the Ivory Coast, Senegal, Cameroon, Mali and Benin.

The company simultaneously operates the ecommerce business as well as an integrated and proprietary logistics platform that accurately delivers parcels. Afrimarket now has more than 200 employees. In 2019, Afrimarket received the prix de la future licorne française.

In 2014, Rania was named among the “30 Women to Watch” by L’Express. She was appointed to the French National Digital Council in 2015 and received the Entrepreneur’s Award of the year in 2016 from MEDEF. She was also recognized by the “Club 21eme siecle» and was voted e-commerce personality of the year in 2018.



ELSY BOGLIOLI
CEO, BioUp
FRENCH 2018 YOUNG LEADER

Elsy Boglioli is the CEO of BioUp, a consulting firm focused on biotech and healthcare, advising start-ups, mid-sized companies, and investors.

Previously she was Executive Vice President, Chief Operating Officer at Collectis, a French biotechnology company focused on gene editing and its applications in oncology. She joined Collectis in December 2017 and was in charge of various strategic and operational functions: strategy, business development, cross functional management of clinical programs of the company, and finally building autonomous manufacturing capacity.

Prior to joining Collectis, Elsy worked at the Boston Consulting Group (BCG) where she served as Partner and Managing Director, and leader of BCG’s biotech-focused business in Europe. Elsy has far-reaching expertise within the pharma and medtech industries, ranging from corporate strategy and M&A to research & development. At BCG, she was also a member of the global biopharma leadership team and global strategy practice management team and served as regional head of the strategy practice for Europe.

Elsy graduated from the Ecole Polytechnique in Paris, France and holds a master’s degree in economy and management from the Pompeu Fabra University in Barcelona, Spain.

Beyond her professional activities, Elsy is passionate about travelling the world, practices thai boxing and is the happy mother of a 3 year old little Alma.

PRESIDENT AND CEO, GLOBAL TIES U.S.
US 2018 YOUNG LEADER

Dr. Katherine Brown is the President and CEO of Global Ties U.S. and the Global Ties Foundation, the largest and oldest citizen diplomacy network in the United States. She is also an Adjunct Assistant Professor at Georgetown University’s Security Studies Program and a Non-Resident Senior Associate at the Center for Strategic and International Studies’ (CSIS) Human Rights Initiative.

Before joining Global Ties in 2018, Katherine was a Public Policy Manager at Facebook, Inc., where she was also in residence as a 2016–2017 Council on Foreign Relations’ (CFR) International Affairs Fellow. From 2013 to 2016, Katherine served as Executive Director of the U.S. Advisory Commission on Public Diplomacy, an office authorized by Congress to appraise and strengthen U.S. engagement activities with foreign citizens. She previously served in the U.S. government as an assistant to the National Security Adviser at the White House; as a Communications Adviser at the U.S. embassy in Kabul; and as a Professional Staff Member for the Committee on Foreign Affairs at the U.S. House of Representatives. Katherine also worked throughout South Asia as a Communications Manager for The Asia Foundation and as one of the original editorial staff members for Bloomberg View, the opinion platform for Bloomberg News. She received her Ph.D. in communications from Columbia University in 2013. Her book, “Dateline Kabul: Storytelling of Modern Afghanistan and America’s Longest War” will be released by Oxford University Press in summer 2018. Katherine is a Member of the University of Southern California’s Center on Public Diplomacy Board and a former term member at the Council on Foreign Relations.



JOY BONAGURO
HEAD OF PEOPLE, OPERATIONS AND DATA, CORELIGHT
US 2018 YOUNG LEADER

Joy Bonaguro has spent her career working at the nexus of policy, data, design and technology. She is currently the Head of People, Operations, and Data at the cybersecurity firm Corelight. Previously, she was the first Chief Data Officer for the City and County of San Francisco, where she manages DataSF. The mission of DataSF is to empower use of data, transforming the way the city works through data. DataSF focuses its

work on streamlining data access, improving data management and governance, and boosting capacity to use data through training and data science.

Prior to joining the City, Joy developed technology, cyber and privacy policy across the Department of Energy's National Laboratory System. She also worked from the birth of the open data and data democratization movements, spending seven years designing and managing the development of information systems to support planning and decision-making in New Orleans. Joy earned her Master's degree from UC Berkeley's Goldman School of Public Policy and her Bachelor's in Mathematics and Philosophy from Tulane University.



ERWIN BRUDER
OFFICER, FRENCH ARMY
FRENCH 2019 YOUNG LEADER

At the age of 36, lieutenant-colonel Erwin Bruder attends the Ecole de Guerre course, which prepares selected advanced officers of the French armed forces to become tomorrow's military leaders.

Before joining the Army, he practiced Judo in high school at Pôle France de Brétigny-sur-Orge. In 2000, he became France Vice Champion and won medals with the French selection in international competitions.

For his studies, he moved to Lycee Henri IV to attend an intensive post-high school course focused on mathematics. He then joined the military academy of Saint-Cyr in 2003, where he ranked as the head of his class, obtained an engineering degree and spent a semester at the University of San Diego.

From 2007 to 2015, he served in the paratroopers, where he took command of a company composed of 130 elite soldiers and developed pioneering capacities such as skydiving with oxygen. He commanded many sensitive operations and was promoted Knight of the Legion of Honor at 31 for having led significant actions under fire.

Interested in international relations, he graduated from the University of Lyon III and joined the Defense Minister's office in 2015, where he worked on topics related to the USA, NATO and the EU.

In addition, he enjoys deepening his knowledge regarding leadership and commitment in the armed forces and delivers talks in business schools on this subject. He is to join HEC next year for further academic courses. Erwin is married and enjoys mountaineering with his wife.

Félicie Burelle graduated from the ESCE Business School, holds a graduate degree in Business Finance from South Bank University of London, and an MBA from the Instituto de Empresa Business School of Madrid.

After beginning her career at Compagnie Plastic Omnium in 2001 as Accounting Manager at the Intelligent Exterior Systems division in Spain, Félicie Burelle moved to the Merger & Acquisitions department of Ernst & Young Transaction Services in 2005, where she specialized in international sell and buy-side M&A processes in the plastic packaging sector. In 2010, she returned to Plastic Omnium and took over the Department of Strategic Planning and Commercial Coordination of Intelligent Exterior Systems, of which she is also part of the Executive Committee.

Félicie Burelle has been a board member of the family holding Burelle SA since 2013. In 2015, she became Strategy and Development Director of Plastic Omnium, responsible for piloting the group's strategic planning, implementing the M&A roadmap and deploying open innovation activities. She has been a member of the Group Executive Committee since then.

Since 2017, she has also been a board member of CIC Lyonnaise de Banque. Since January 1st, 2018, Félicie Burelle has been the Deputy Chief Executive Officer of Compagnie Plastic Omnium.



MEGAN CARROLL
TEAM LEADER, PEACEKEEPING AND EVALUATION
SECTION, UNITED NATIONS
US 2018 YOUNG LEADER

Megan Carroll evaluates peacekeeping missions for the United Nations (UN). Prior to this, she served as the Team Leader, Partnerships, for the UN's Departments of Peacekeeping Operations and Field Support. She focused on the UN's partnership with the World Bank and contributed to the recent joint UN-WB report, "Pathways for Peace." Previously, she was

appointed by President Obama to serve as a White House Fellow.

Her work has taken her to five continents, notably to South Sudan and Sudan where she led the United Nations Development Program's Democracy and Participation portfolio; served as Acting Director of The Carter Center's Democracy and Conflict Resolution Programs; and Democracy and Governance Advisor to USAID/South Sudan, at a critical juncture when the mission transitioned from a U.S. Consulate to Embassy in a newly-independent nation. Earlier in her career, Megan managed Harvard University's Scholars at Risk Program and taught in Japan through the Japan Exchange and Teaching (JET) Program. She holds a Master in Public Policy from the Harvard Kennedy School and a B.A. in Political Science from Amherst College. After graduate school, she spent a year as a Sauvé Scholar at McGill University. She is a Council on Foreign Relations Term Member, Humanity in Action Senior Fellow, and Truman National Security Fellow.

Geoffrey Chepiga is a litigation partner at Paul, Weiss, Rifkind, Wharton & Garrison LLP, a global law firm. Geoffrey represents leading companies, their directors and officers in a variety of litigation and regulatory matters, with a particular focus on securities defense, M&A disputes and white collar investigations. Recent matters include a major

French public company under investigation by the SEC and the DOJ under the Foreign Corrupt Practice Act; the State of Qatar in a lawsuit against several banks alleging market manipulation; SAC Capital (now Point72 Asset Management) and Steven A. Cohen in criminal and regulatory proceedings and civil litigations arising out of claims of insider trading; and a leading private equity firm in a shareholder appraisal action arising from its acquisition of a portfolio company.

Geoffrey also maintains an active pro bono practice, a highlight of which is his representation of a class of individuals in New York City with mental illness against the State of New York challenging the way the state provides mental health services. After ten years of litigation, the parties reached a landmark settlement to end the state's decades-long discrimination under the Americans with Disabilities Act. Geoffrey also represents many individuals and their families in immigration and asylum cases.

Prior to joining Paul, Weiss, Geoffrey clerked for the Honorable Naomi Reice Buchwald of the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York and Chief Judge Dennis Jacobs of the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit.

Geoffrey graduated from Yale College, cum laude, with a B.A. in History and English. He received an M.Phil from the University of Cambridge in the History of Political Thought, and earned a J.D. from Yale Law School. He is the co-author of "Ownership of Use? Civilian Property Interests in International Humanitarian Law", which appeared in the 59th volume of Harvard International Law Journal in 2008.

Geoffrey lives in New York City with his wife and two daughters.

Nicolas started at BCG in 2005 after working for Baracoda, a NY-based startup specializing in connected devices. At BCG he has dedicated his career to data and technology-driven transformations,

working across the Telecom, Media and Consumer industries in Paris and New York.

Since 2016 he has been the French leader of BCG GAMMA, BCG's unit dedicated to data science and artificial intelligence, where he supports leading corporations and institutions in leveraging AI to transform their company and build disruptive businesses. He is also the global leader of BCG's Marketing department and a member of the global leadership team of its Marketing, Sales and Pricing business.

Beyond his role at BCG, Nicolas is an active investor and advisor for digital brands and services such as INSIDR (a content and service platform for individual travelers) and Waterdrop (a direct-to-consumer brand pioneering Microdrinks). He also advises several think tanks and academical research groups on the impact of artificial intelligence on business and society.

Bhama Ramkhelawon is an assistant professor in the department of surgery and cell biology and the director of the vascular research program at New York University Langone Medical Center. She has held this position since 2016 and heads a team of scientists focused at understanding the physiopathology of complex life-threatening cardiovascular diseases.

Her research integrates the study of how imbalances in the immune response of the aortic wall can promote cardiovascular diseases. In particular, her work aims to identify the signals that dysregulate the immune system of the vasculature and to determine their role in promoting vascular diseases. Recently, her work has uncovered important crosstalk mechanisms between arterial macrophages and vascular cells thereby uncovering important pathological mechanisms that culminate in the destruction of the blood vessel wall leading to life-threatening aneurysm disease. She is now utilizing state-of-the-art gene therapy strategies to develop novel drug-based avenues to alleviate the burden of individuals with aneurysm disease.

She has published several landmark papers which have described the role of retention signals in regulating the traffic of immune cells in cardiovascular diseases. To date, she has published over thirty peer reviewed research articles that have appeared in journals including Nature Medicine, Nature Immunology and Nature Communications. Her research has been funded by the American Heart Association and the National Institutes of Health. She won numerous awards including Académie de Médecine excellence thesis prize, UNESCO/L'OREAL women in science international rising talent award and recently the American Heart Association early career investigator award. She has also participated to several events advocating for women in science.

She holds a Ph.D. in cardiovascular diseases from University Paris V/VII and was a post-doctoral fellow at New York University Langone Medical Center prior to her faculty appointment. She is native of Mauritius and is fluent in English, French, Creole, Hindi and speaks some Japanese.

STEVEN KOCH

Steven Koch served as Deputy Mayor of the City of Chicago from September 2012 to August 2017, leading key initiatives related to economic development, planning, job development, budget issues, municipal finance and revenue. Koch previously spent 27 years at Credit Suisse, where he ran and chaired the global mergers and acquisitions business. Under his leadership, the business saw yearly peak revenues of \$2.5 billion. Koch's past civic commitments include chair of the Sinai Health System of Chicago and the Greater Chicago Food Depository and co-chair of the City of Chicago's Green Ribbon Commission on Sustainability and Climate Change. He is also a life trustee of the Francis Parker School.

Koch received his B.A. from Hampshire College, his M.B.A. from the University of Chicago Booth School of Business and his J.D., cum laude, from the University of Chicago Law School. He was a Henry Luce Fellow and served as a law clerk for Judge Richard Cudahy of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Seventh.



RAHM EMANUEL
FORMER MAYOR OF CHICAGO

Rahm Emanuel served as the 55th mayor of Chicago from 2011 to 2019. He previously served as President Obama's chief of staff and as chairman of both the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee and the House Democratic Caucus.

Born in Chicago, Emanuel is a graduate of Sarah Lawrence College and Northwestern University. Working early in his career in Democratic politics, Emanuel was appointed as director of the finance committee for Bill Clinton's 1992 presidential campaign. In 1993, he joined the Clinton Administration, where he served as the assistant to the president for political affairs and as the Senior Advisor to the President for policy and strategy before resigning, in 1998. Beginning a career in finance, Emanuel worked at the investment bank Wasserstein Perella & Co. from 1998 for 2½ years, and served on the board of directors of Freddie Mac.

In 2002, Emanuel ran for the seat in the U.S. House of Representatives vacated by Rod Blagojevich, who resigned to become governor of Illinois. Emanuel won the first of three terms representing Illinois's 5th congressional district, a seat he held from 2003 to 2009. During his tenure in the House, Emanuel held two Democratic leadership positions, serving as the chair of the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee from 2005 to 2007, and as the chair of the House Democratic Caucus, from 2007 to 2009. After the 2008 presidential election, President Barack Obama appointed Emanuel to serve as White House Chief of Staff.



THOMAS WYLER
SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT FOR GLOBAL STRATEGY AND BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT, PSP PARTNERS
US 2015 YOUNG LEADER

Tom is Senior Vice President for Global Strategy and Business Development at PSP Partners in Chicago. He is responsible for working across PSP deal teams and portfolio companies to identify, develop, and support investment opportunities in markets around the world.

Previously, Tom served as Counselor to the Secretary and Senior Advisor for International Economics at the US Department of Commerce. In that capacity, he was the architect of Secretary Pritzker's commercial diplomacy strategy and her efforts to strengthen American economic ties to countries around the world. SAM YAGAN **CO-FOUNDER, OKCUPID; INTERNET ENTREPRENEUR**

Sam Yagan is an American Internet entrepreneur best known as the co-founder of OkCupid. In 2013, he was named to TIME Magazine's '100 Most Influential People in the World' list. He is the Vice-Chairman of the e-dating site Match.com.

Sam was instilled with an entrepreneurial spirit at a young age. He grew up in Bourbonnais, Illinois, and studied at the Illinois Math and Science Academy and eventually Harvard University. Yagan holds a bachelor's degree in Applied Mathematics and Economics from Harvard University and an MBA from Stanford University, where he earned distinction as a Siebel Scholar, an Arjay Miller Scholar, and the Henry Ford Scholar, the award granted to each class's valedictorian.

In 1999, during his senior year at Harvard, Yagan and two of his classmates, Chris Coyne and Max Krohn, started the online study guide SparkNotes. Christian Rudder joined shortly after the founding. A year later they sold the company to Barnes & Noble for \$30 million.

In 2003, Yagan again teamed up with his Harvard classmates Chris Coyne and Max Krohn and founded OkCupid. In 2011, Yagan sold OkCupid for \$50 million and in 2012, Yagan became the CEO of Match.com. In April 2013, Yagan was listed as one of TIME Magazine's '100 Most Influential People in the World'.



JOHN LIST **CHAIRMAN IN THE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS, UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO**

John List is the Homer J. Livingston Professor and Chairman in the Department of Economics at the University of Chicago. He also holds a position as a National Bureau of Economic Research Associate. John has previously served as a Senior Economist on the President's Council of Economic Advisers (2002-2004).

John has pioneered field experiments as a methodology for learning about behavioral principles that are shared across different domains. He has published over 150 peer-reviewed research publications, providing insights into charitable giving, public goods provision, and valuation of non-marketed goods and services. John received the 2010 Kenneth Galbraith Award and the 2008 Arrow Prize for Senior Economists for his research in behavioral economics in the field. Overall, data John has collected has provided insights into incentives for education, pricing behavior, discrimination in the marketplace, the valuation of non-marketed goods and services, public goods provision, and importantly, charitable giving.

As the PI of SPI, John plans to lead the team in generating knowledge in the field of philanthropy and bridging the gap between research and practice by forming collaborative partnerships. John's research on philanthropy has been showcased in various media outlets such as the Wall Street Journal, Chronicle of Philanthropy, and the New York Times.

Christopher Jaffe is a Chicago-based non-profit leader and consultant. With more than a decade of experience in the field, he has professionally supported more than 20 social service organizations to improve development and operations systems, design and implement programs, strategically plan large-scale growth, and to build capacity with fidelity. In his current role, Bacon serves as Curriculum Specialist for both the BAM Pilot Programs in Boston, MA and in Seattle, WA. He currently lives in Hyde Park, Chicago with his 2 young sons.

James Rondeau is the President and Eloise W. Martin Director of the Art Institute of Chicago. 


LESLIE BLUHM **CO-FOUNDER, CHICAGO CARES**



The Fairmont Hotel is located near the Downtown Loop, just north of Millennium Park.



NEIGHBORHOODS

Chicago has many distinct neighborhoods, each with its own history and character. Generally, locals separate the city into The Loop (the business center of the city), the West Side, the North Side, and the South Side.

BURNHAM PLAN

In 1909, Daniel Burnham and Edward H. Bennet published Plan of Chicago, a document enumerating several propositions that the authors felt would improve the city. These plans included expanding public access to the lakefront; a new highway system; new civic and cultural centers; a standardized arrangement of city streets; and the improvement of railway terminals. Some of these plans were implemented (hampered somewhat by the Great Depression), and Burnham's proposals continue to inspire city planners today.

CHICAGO HISTORY

TIMELINE

- The city's metropolitan area is the third most populous city in the US.
- Chicago was founded in 1833 as a town of about 200 people. Chicago became a city in 1837, and quickly expanded through the 19th century.
- In 1871, the Great Chicago Fire swept through the city and destroyed several square miles, leaving over 100,000 people homeless.
- Not only did the city rebuild, using the opportunity to put new steel buildings in place of the old wooden ones, but it was chosen as the site of the World's Fair in 1893, only 22 years after the Fire.
- Chicago was the site of the world's first skyscraper, the Home Insurance Building, built in 1885.
- In the 1870s and 1880s, Chicago led the movement for improved public health and sanitation, constructing the first city-wide sewage system in the United States.
- This project included changing the direction of the flow of the Chicago River, an incredible feat of engineering.
- Chicago was a major destination for immigrants settling in The US — in 1900, 77% of residents were foreign-born or had been born in the US to foreign parents.
- Most of the train lines in the 19th century ran through Chicago, and a group of the city's railway managers created a standardized set of time zones for the US, which are still used today.
- The Great Migration of job-seeking African-Americans during WWI led to a Chicago Black Renaissance in art and literature.
- Prohibition led to the city being famously gangster-run, lasting until about 1933 (the repeal of Prohibition).
- Chicago is a famously industrialized city, and during WWII the city produced more steel than the entirety of the UK or Nazi Germany.
- Jane Byrne was elected Chicago's first female mayor in 1979. Four years later, Harold Washington became the city's first African-American mayor.

Entry is free to this beautiful greenhouse. Exotic plants are organized by area of origin, allowing visitors to wander through distinct biospheres.

THE MAGNIFICENT MILE

Michigan Avenue (also known as the Magnificent Mile) boasts luxury stores as well as smaller boutiques, in between beds of seasonal flowers.

NINE DRAGON WALL

At the entrance to Chicago's Chinatown stands this intricate ceramic wall. It is a reproduction of the Nine Dragon Wall in Beijing, and one of only three replicas outside of China.



FRANK LLOYD WRIGHT'S "ROBIE" HOUSE

For those interested in architecture, the Robie house is unmissable. This well-maintained house, completed in 1910, helped pioneer the Prairie style.

Tours available Thursday - Monday, and should be booked in advance.



CHAGALL FOUR SEASONS MOSAIC

This huge mosaic piece by artist Chagall is not too far from the Fairmont Hotel. If you're in the mood to walk for ten minutes and take in some free art, this is the opportunity.



WRIGLEY FIELD

Home of the Chicago Cubs and perhaps the most famous sports field, Wrigley has over 100 years of sports history, and is only a 30-minute trip on public transit from the Fairmont.

CHICAGO CULTURAL CENTER

The city's cultural center, which hosts various traveling art and informative displays, also features two enormous stained-glass domes. Admission is free.

Open Monday - Friday from 10 AM - 7 PM, and weekends from 10 AM - 5 PM. Within walking distance from the Fairmont.



RICHARD H. DRIEHAUS MUSEUM

This old historic mansion now holds several art collections as well as beautiful stained glass windows. Tickets are \$20/person, and tours are available.

GANGSTERS AND GHOSTS TOUR

Chicago is famous as a city with a strong history of organized crime. Learn all about the incredible stories of the city's mobsters with this guided two-hour walking tour. Reservations required; pricing and availability may vary.



AMERICAN WRITERS MUSEUM

An entire museum dedicated to American authors and the effects they had on the course of history. With a special emphasis on female authors and authors of color, this is a small but must-see museum.

JACKSON PARK

This large park is free to enjoy, and is also home to a beautiful Japanese Garden and Wooded Island. The entire park was the site of the World's Fair of 1893, and is still home to the golden Statue of the Republic that was part of the original fairgrounds.



NATIONAL MUSEUM OF MEXICAN ART

This museum houses one of the nation's largest collections of Mexican art, including artifacts, folk art, and textiles. Go to soak up culture and learn more about the diverse neighborhoods of Chicago.
